We have enjoyed watching the TV programme about the renovation of a derelict chateau with Dick and Angel Strawbridge. I received the book about their first year, for Christmas, which filled in some of the gaps left by the TV presentation. Mostly, we have enjoyed seeing the views from their windows across the beautiful countryside in a part of France of which we are very fond. Some years ago we had a brief encounter with a Fenland farmhouse for renovation, but it did not last long, as it sold for more than we could afford, which, on reflection, was probably a good thing. We humans have a need for a shelter, a place of refuge and safety, and a comfortable living space.
