

## TRINITY NOTICES AND NEWSLETTER FOR 16th June to 19th June

On June 12<sup>th</sup>, Methodist Homes Sunday was celebrated with the Chaplain of The Martins, Mr. Francis Carr, when he shared the sense of joy which comes from gardens and the natural world. There was a national appeal from MHA for funds to enable a continuation of the enjoyment of God's creation of gardens, helping people to "live later life well".
