READING

Acts 7:55-60 The Stoning of Stephen

Filled with the Holy Spirit, he gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. ⁵⁶ "Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" ⁵⁷ But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. ⁵⁸ Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. ⁵⁹ While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." ⁶⁰ Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died.

REFLECTION by Jenny Benfield

Are we ready for anything?

'You have to be ready for anything these days' is a phrase we sometimes hear, but maybe we don't actually ask ourselves 'How can we be 'ready for anything'?'

The story of the stoning of Stephen may help us to find some answers to the question. Firstly, Stephen looked up into heaven and there he saw the glory of God. Secondly, he committed himself into God's hands, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit', he said. Finally, he fell asleep and, just as when he had to defend himself in front of the Sanhedrin, people would have seen that his face was like the face of an angel. Stephen was 'ready for anything'!

Seeing the glory of God was an awe-inspiring and strengthening experience for Stephen. It was possibly like the vision we might have from the top of Snowdon or Ben Nevis. What do we see? Nothing but thick cloud! However, suddenly the mist lifts and we see the tiny village of Llanberis in the valley, or the town of Fort William in the distance. They have been there all the time, but we can only see them when the mist lifts and we are granted that vision. In Stephen's story he suddenly sees the God of glory Himself. He is now 'ready for anything' because he has seen the place where heaven and earth meet, and he is at peace. I'm reminded of an old communion hymn we used to sing:

⁶Here, O my Lord, I see Thee face to face, Here would I touch and handle things unseen. Here grasp with firmer hand the eternal grace, And all my weariness upon Thee lean'. MHB 772

In using the words 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit', Stephen is guoting from Psalm 31. The people of Israel looked on helplessly as troubles overtook them and they had little alternative but to say to God 'Into Your hands I commit my spirit - my times are in Your hands'. They remembered the past when God brought about a rescue, so looking to the future, they were able to say, 'But I trust in You, O Lord'. We, too, are able to concur with the hymn writer of old, who wrote 'Your love in time past forbids' me to think You'll leave me at last in trouble to sink'. Whatever happens, our times are in His hands. Thus we are made 'ready for anything'. Finally Stephen faced everything with the face of an angel. Perhaps, like Moses when he came down from the mountain after talking with God, the people saw a kind of light illuminating Stephen from the inside, a kind of confident serenity. He was 'ready for anything' the Jews would throw at him because he had seen the glory of God, he had committed himself into God's hands and he was at peace. Many down the years have suffered for their faith, and continue to do so, but remained serene. Most of us won't be called to that kind of 'martvrdom', but our troubles are no less real and hard to cope with. Thank God that He still shows us His glory, when we lift our eyes to Him and acknowledge that our times are in His hands. Then we, too, shall be given that inner radiance and peace, which means we are 'ready for anything'. Praise the Lord!
